East on N. Line Section 11

I began this survey at the corner to Sec's 3-2-10-11 which is a 5/8" Iron Pin driven in the pavement, which point I re-established in my survey of the S.E. 1 of Section 3, T. 4 N., R. 28 E., W.M. and dated June 1949.

Running thence S.89° - 31' E., which is the bearing given in the original Gov't field notes, I checked into a 1" I.Pipe and measured 1320.45 feet. (Storm's measured distance was 1320.6 ft.) Producing this line on East easterly, I found a 1" I. Pipe 8" beneath the ground surface. My measurement to it from the 1/16 cor. was 1321.4 ft. (Gov't notes show 1321.6 ft.)

South on W. line Section 11

Described in my field notes in my survey of S.E 1/4 of Sect. 3, T. 4 N., R. 28 E., W.M. Dated June 1949. This line was re-established by the Oregon Highway Dept. and C.H. Storms and Associates.

## Street Centerlines

First Street

As constructed by Ore State Highway Dept. A bronze disk monument was placed on the East right of way line near th N.E. corner of First and Elm Streets. Marked Sta. 261 / 02.8. Highway Dept. drove nails on centerline of First St. at 100' intervals.

Elm Ave.

According to existing property and fence lines, Elm Ave was planned to be 60° wide. The 1/16 cor. which is the N.E. cor. of this property is exactly between existing fence lines.

Fourth St.

I found a hub with tack at the N.E. cor. of Morningside Tracts which point is the centerline of E. 4 St. The distance west from this point to the block corner was 30'. I measured from the hub to the 1/16 corner 410° which is the correct distance according to the Deed record.

McNary St.

Ran parallel to First St.

Dogwood Ave.

I found some property corners in Osburn Tracts and ran the centerline of Dogwood Ave. easterly to the west, line of Lakeview Tracts. Turned an angle of 0°-06 to the right making the bearing of Dogwood Ave S89°-28'E and parallel to the South line of Lakeview and the North line of Morningside Tracts.

Established INITIAL POINT as shown on Plat. Ran southerly on east right of way line of the highway and established S.W. cor. of tract. Ran a line to the N.W. cor. of Morningside Tracts continued sh 2
