That all of said notices were securely ported in plain view of the public and remained so posted from and including the 5th day of November 1905, until the Cth day of January 1906, and or more than 30 days previous to the presentation of said petition, and that said petition was signed by more than 12 feecholders residing in the Road District where said proposed road is to be established. It is therefore hereby OPDERED by the Court that the Board of County Toad viewers to-wit: John W Kimbrell as Surveyor, J M Ferguson and Frank Rack as Viewers be and they are hereby ordered to meet at the o fice of the County Surveyor in Pendleton, Oregon, on the 22nd day of January 1906, or within 5 days thereafter and proceed to view lay out and establish said road and to estimate the cost of opening said read and report their doings to this court at its next regular term.
