My dear Mr. Secretary:

The Secretary of the Interior.

There are transmitted herewith the papers relative to the application of the Umstilla County Court, for public highway right of way across various restricted ellotments on the Umstille Heservetion.

The application states that the right of way will be dO feet wide and extend through the reservation for a distance of 4 miles; and that it will eliminate a greek crossing and raise and straighten the route.

The Superintendent reports that the Indians will be creatly benefited by the road; that the advantages of same will offset any demages; and that the Indian owners have given their consent thereto without demages, as shown by signed statements in the file.

Under the circumstances, it is recommended that the application be approved without damages, subject to the provisions of the Act of Marsh 5, 1901 (31 Stat. L., 1084), and departmental regulations thereunder; and subject also to any prior, valid, existing right or advarse claim.
