RE: Poverty Flat Road Right-of-Way Issues

After researching the right-of-way for Poverty Flat Road prior to staking for the L.I.D., some problems were found. It appears that the portion from the freeway south to the reservation boundary doesn't legally exist.

In 1922 Road 824 was established by the County Court, though its legality was challenged by the Bureau of Indian Affairs (see attachments). It was then vacated in 1924, mainly because the road that was being traveled (near the present-day road) was more practical (see map for vacated portion). Unfortunately, nothing was ever done to acquire right-of-way for the traveled road.

In 2002 the B.L.M. did a survey in the area which I expect was done at the B.I.A.'s request. They state in their official field notes that no records for Road 1021 exist, so I'm sure that the B.I.A. is already aware of the problem. There is a an application form for obtaining rights-of-way across federal lands that we've used before for portions of our roads that are on B.L.M. ground which we will probably have to fill out and then see what other hoops we'll have to jump through with the B.I.A. and C.T.U.I.R. I've attached the following for your information:

The portion of the road from the Reservation boundary south will need to be legalized through normal procedures at a later date.

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable that a County Highway or road be located and established on territory leading from the Old Oregon Trail to the south boundary of the Umatilla Indian Reservation on Cabbage Hill,) County of Umatilla, State of Oregon, said Highway or road being commonly known and designated as the (B&llinger Road) and that said Highway or road be located, established, altered, straightened, widencounty and changed by Resolution of the County Court of Umatilla, State of Oregon.

AND WHEREAS, this being a regular term of the Umatilla County Court and the said Court being now in regular session, sitting for a the transaction of County business with all members of said Court present,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Court of the County of Umatilla, State of Oregon, sitting at the regular monthly term fof the Monthy of August, 1922, in the County Court Room of the Court House, in Pendleton, Umatilla County, State of Oregon, for the transaction of County business, that it is, and is hereby declared to be the intention of the said County Court to locate and establish a highway or road on and over a route as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED that the proposed B&llinger Road shall commence, run and terminate as follows, to-wit:

(Beginning at a point 134 feet west of the Quarter Section corner between sections 8 and 17, Tp. 1 North Range 34 E.W.M. in the South boundary of the Umatilla Indian Reservation and running thence n on a curve to the left, whose tangent at a point 237.3 feet due south *fection Corner* of the quarter **EXERCISE** common to Sections 8 and 17, Tp. 1 North, Range 34 E.W.M., is the North and South center line through said section 17, with a radius of 286.5 feet - 109 feet; thence North 79° 24' West 23.14 feet; thence on a curve to the right of radius of 229.2 feet for 93.84 feet; thence North 55° 56' West, 514.5 feet; thence on a curve to the right with a radius of 110.2 feet; for 178 feet; thence North 36° 58' East, 1872.59 feet; thence on a curve to the left with a radius of 286.5 feet, for 212.6 feet; thence North 5° 54' West 560 feet; thence on a curve to the right with a radius of 409.3 feet for 248 feet; thence North 27° 08' East 35.87 feet; thence on a curve to left with a radius of 173.6 feet; for 160.1 feet; thence North 28° 43' West 217.62 feet; thence on a curve to the right with a radius of 1146 feet; for 440.4 feet; thence North 1° 41' West 107.88 feet; thence $\frac{1}{100}$ ° 41' West, 232 feet to a point in the center line of the Old Oregon Trail.

The width of said right of way on roadway to be a making strip of land thirty feetwide on each side of the above described line making a total road way sixty feet in width.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a public necessity for said Highway or Road is hereby declared to exist for the following reason, to-wit: That the existing roads (between the Old Oregon Trail and the territory to the South known as Cabbage Hill) are inadequater to accommodate the public traffic and in order to accommodate the said traffis it is necessary that a shorter route of more uniform grade be established

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the above entitled matter be heard at the regular September term for the year 1922 of said County Court at the County Court Room in the Court House at Pendleton, in the County of Umatilla, State of Oregon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that true copies of this Resolution, properly certified to as such by the County Clerk, be posted by the County Roadmaster as follows, to-wit: That a copy be posted upon the Bulletin Board at the North entrance of the Court House in the City of Pendleton, Umatilla County, State of Oregon, said Court House being the place where the County Court isheld; that one copy be posted at the initial or beginning point of said proposed road; that one copy be posted at the end of the said proposed road; and that one copy be posted in the vicinity of the said proposed road at some point between the beginning and the end of the said proposed road, and that this Resolution be duly entered in the Commissioners' Journal.

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TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR UMATILLA COUNTY: -

We, the undersigned Board of County Road Viewers heretofore instructed to view said road submit the following report:

Pursuant to our order, we met at Pendleton, Oregon, on the 13th dayof September, 1922, the viewers having qualified, we procedded to view said road. It is our opinion that this road will be a benefit to the public and therefore most respectfully recommend that it be opened as a public highway of Umatilla County, State of Oregon.

We estimate the opening of said road at \$300.00.

We find that the following described pieces of land across or through which this road will be located or established will be made less valuable in the sums given after each description.

Racheal Van Pelt, #529, NW1NE1, Section 8, Township 1 North, Range 34 E.W.M. \$5.00.

Dear Sir :-

I have the honor to acknowledge receipt of copy of your lotter of August 12, 1922, addressed to Hon. N.J. Sinnott, of the House of Aspresentatives, with the andlosures, viz: Letter addressed to you by Allen Patawa; a lotter addressed to Mr. Patawa by Allen Bynon, Assistant United States Attorney for the District of Oregon.

This correspondence relates to proposed road across Indian lands on the Umatilla reservation. I enclose a blue print map marked "A." showing a proposed road from the Old Oregon Freil Highway to the reservation line.

This may was propared by Unatille County. but this road has been abandoned, as it is not satisfactory to the County. Another blue print map enclosed. marked "B" is the road which Unatilla County desires. It involves trust allotments #509 - Rechel 2. VenBelt; #566 - James Grane; #561 - Penotulteanen; #525 - Meses Eloyd and #524 Feter Eloyd.

The Lloyd boys are brothers and are minorstheir father being Mitchell Lloyd. Rachel E. VanPelt is a minor - her father being dead and her mother, Jennie VanPelt. James Grane and Mrs. Allen Potawa are adults.

The matter of this read has been agitated for several years, and is a connection from a district south of the reservation called Cabbage Hill to the Old Oregon Trail Highway across the Umatilla Reservation. Its approminate distance is one mile, and the land involved is all trust allotted property. There has been a road across these lands for many years, following to some extent the road marked on map "A".

Several weeks ago I appeared before the Unitilla County Court at Pendleton with Allen Patawa, husband of Mrs. Allen Patawa, Mitchell Lloyd, father of the two Lloyd boys, and James Grane.

We went there, at the request of the County Court, in an effort to adjudicate the damages which the public road across these lands 60 feet wide would cost. Patawa asked \$262.50 for a right of way across the allotment of his wife. Mitchell Lloyd asked \$375.00 for a right of way across the allotments of his two children. James Crane asked \$131.25 for right of way across his allotment. The County Court considered these sums excessive. They offered Allen Patawa \$87.50; Mitchell Lloyd \$125.00 and James Crane \$26.25. These amounts the Indians rejected, and they left without any further action.

Unstille County Court is now seeking to obtain a right of way across these lands by resolution of the County Court - see section 4556 of Statutes of the State of Oregon - copy enclosed. And the Road - through its Roadmaster, has posted notices on the lands affected, of the resolution of the County Court.

The copy of Statutes enclosed shows the method of procedure which the court evidently intends to follow in procuring the right of way.

A new days ago I called on the County Court and advised them that it was my opinion that the laws as referred to were not applicable in obtaining right of way for roads across Indian trust lands. As stated heretofore, these lands are held in trust by the United States Government and the State law, in my opinion, cannot be invoked for the purpose of obtaining this right of way. I cited the County Court to the last paragraph of Section 3 of the Act of Congress March 3, 1901, 31 Statutes 1058-1084, reading as follows:

"That land allotted in severalty to Indians may be condemned for any public purpose under the laws of the State or Territory where located in the same manner as land owned in fee may be condemned, and the money awarded as damages shall be paid to the allottee."

In my opinion the above federal law is applicable. The present road across these lands is not satisfactory it is hilly and cannot be made a standard State road without excessive expense.

I believe the County should have right of way across these lands, but feel the county dil not offer the Indians hat such a right of way is worth. On the other hand, I think the Indians asked more than they should have.

It is my opinion that your office should refer this matter to the attornoy general, and request that United States Attorney for the District of Oregon be instructed to appear for the Indians affected by this road, in order that their rights may be properly protected.

When anything further develops in this matter that is of importance, I will immediately write you.

Sir:

There are inclosed herewith two copies of letter dated September 20, 1922, with inclosures received from the Superintendent of the Umatilla Indian School, Pendleton, Oregon, relative to the proceedings had before the Umatilla County (Oregon) court, concerning the opening of a public highway across certain Umatilla Indian allotments as follows:

Said allotments were made under the act of March 2, 1917 (39 Stat. L., 969-998), and trust patents were issued therefor under the act of February 8, 1887 (24 Stat. L., 388) as amended, providing for a twentyfive year trust period which has not yet expired.

The record shows that the county court was unwilling to allow the allottees the amount of damages which they demand, and the Superintendent says that although he considers the amounts asked for by the allottees are excessive the damages offered by the county court are not sufficient compensation for the desired right of way.

He says that the county court is now reported to be taking steps under the Oregon State laws of eminent domain to acquire the right of way in question and recommends that the matter be referred to the Department of Justice for appropriate action. In this connection the act of March 3, 1901 (31 Stat. L., 1058) contains the following provisions:

Sec. 3.

That lands allotted in severalty to Indians may be condemned for any public purpose under the laws of the State or Territory where located in the same menner as land owned in f fee may be condemned, and the money awarded as demages shall be paid to the allottee.

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Sec. 4. That the Secretary of the Interior is hereby authorized to grant permission, upon complience with such requirements as he may deem necessary, to the proper State or local authorities for the opening and establishment of public highways, in accordance with the laws of the State or Territory in which the lands are situated, through any Indian reservation or through any lands which have been allotted in severalty to any individual Indians under any laws or treaties but which have not been conveyed to the allottees with full power of alignation.

The Office is of opinion that the first section of law above quoted is not applicable to the present case, and that the only way the Umatilla County court can proceed is to comply with said Section 4 of the act of March 3, 1901, and the regulations thereunder.

It is recommended that the Department of Justice be requested to instruct the United States Attorney to enter his appearance in the case for the purpose of contesting the jurisdiction of the court and taking such other action as may be warranted by the laws and the facts.
