History - County Road No. 1219 - 10th Street

In 1989, at the request of the City of Hermiston, that portion of 10th Street from Feedville Road to Highway 395, an unimproved county road, was deeded from the County to the City of Hermiston. However, neither the City or County have any records that a public hearing was held, as required by ORS 373.270. A copy of the Board of Commissioners Meeting minutes and the deed are attached.

In 1995 a petition to vacate that portion of 10th Street from Highway 395 to Airport Way was circulated to area property owners, although it never made it to the Road Department. The City wrote the Road Department a letter expressing several concerns regarding the vacation. A copy of that letter is also attached to this report. The concerns included maintaining easements for City utilities and not landlocking any of the parcels by vacating the road.

History - County Road No. 1202 - Southeast Airport Road

In 1994, a portion of County Road No. 1202 was vacated near its intersection with the west side of Highway 395 when it became apparent that a building was on the original right-of-way. In return, a small parcel of land was dedicated to the County adjacent to the vacated portion to allow legal access to Highway 395. All of that portion of County Road No. 1202 west of Highway 395 is an unimproved right-of-way.

Summary

The City of Hermiston adopted two resolutions (#1437 and #1438) dated December 9, 1996, requesting transfer of jurisdiction of that portion of Southeast Airport Road from Highway 395 to 10th Street and those portions of 10th Street from Feedville Road to Highway 395 and from Highway 395 to Southeast Columbia Drive. The roads are unimproved and are either within the Hermiston City Limits or within their urban growth boundary. Because of the aforementioned concerns and development plans in the area, the City deemed it in the best interest of all parties to acquire jurisdiction of the roads.

Statutes

ORS 373.270 governs the transfer of county roads to city jurisdiction. All notice requirements under this section have been met and all area property owners have been sent copies of the notice of hearing. Pursuant to ORS 373.270(6)(b), a county can surrender jurisdiction with no further action by the city if the city requests the transfer and the county adopts an order transferring the road.

Recommendation

The Public Works Department recommends that the jurisdiction of the roads described in this report be transferred to the City of Hermiston unless any testimony in this hearing shows it not to be in the public interest.

> Commissioner Hansell closes the hearing at this time. Commissioner Youngman motioned to transfer to the City of Hermiston County Road 604 from Feedville Road to Highway 395.

> Commissioner Hansell inquired if the motion could reflect that portion which lies within the urban growth boundary.

Commissioner Youngman clarified his motion to include that area lying within the UGB. Commissioner Hansell seconded that motion and instructed county counsel work with the City of Hermiston on the details. If, for some reason the area within the UGB cannot be included, the Board may have to come and rework their decision. Two in favor, none opposed; motion carried.

Re: Vacation of County Road #1219 between Airport Way and Highway 395 South

Dear Hal:

The City of Hermiston, as an abutting land owner, was recently presented with a petition for vacation of a portion of County Road #1219 near the Hermiston municipal airport. The segment in question is not an improved roadway, but there are City utilities (water and sewer lines) in the right of way. The City would like to make your department aware of two concerns which relate to the petition.

First, the City must have an easement of sufficient width to accommodate the maintenance of City water and sanitary sewer utility lines along the westerly side of the right of way proposed to be vacated. This does not pose a problem where the utility lines pass through City property, as the City can dedicate the necessary easement. Furthermore, in the event of vacation, the only private landowner to whom ownership of the westerly side of the right of way would revert back has already signed a written agreement with the City to convey an easement for utilities.

Second, none of the surrounding parcels should be "landlocked" as a result of the vacation. ODOT records show that Barry Carter and Stella Thompson share a joint access to Highway 395 South at engineering station 380+68.24. Care should be taken to see that these neighbors come up with a workable agreement for sharing the eventual costs and responsibility of building and maintaining a future private approach road to serve as their joint access to the highway. It may also be necessary to have Stella Thompson record a covenant not to sell any of her parcels separately to prevent them from becoming landlocked by transfer of ownership.

Absent these two concerns, the City has no objections to the proposed vacation of County Road #1219 between Airport Way and Highway 395 South.
