### Klaus Road Legalization Report

A portion of Klaus Road (County Road No. 1264) has been surveyed and monumented in anticipation of legalization (see attached survey map) after a discrepancy in the deed from Charles Kik to Umatilla County establishing the road was found during a private survey for Mike Arterburn.

The original road was established in 1910 at a width of 40 feet. In 1975 a petition was received from property owners in the area to vacate a portion of then County Road #686 from the Charles Tracts Subdivision to a point approximately 375 feet west of Sagebrush Road along with the portion of Kik Street lying east of Highway 395 and relocate the road in the area represented by the deed. The petition was for a 60-foot road, but the final order established it as an 80-foot road.

An existing fence on the north was used extensively to position the northerly right of way line of the road. The fence appears to have been built about the time the deed was written and is very solidly constructed, having square concrete pillars as corner posts at the angle points. The travelled road meanders back and forth across the monumented right of way (see map) but is inside of the right of way in all places. Because that part of the road west of the part shown on the map to Highway 395 is in a platted subdivision (Charles Tracts), the beginning point of the legalization was held the same as that on the deed in order to keep the subdivision plat intact. The existing road at the beginning point is very close to the right of way line on the north. Because it is also close to the fence, any future maintenance should tend to move it back towards centerline.

The location of the fence suggests that it was believed to be the right of way line as described in the deed. The purpose of this legalization would be to correct the description of the road to clarify the records for future land transactions and surveys. It would have no effect on any existing improvements or utilities.

Legalization is recommended by the Public Works Department.

## Klaus Road Centerline Description

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A strip of land for road purposes located in the Southeast 1/4 of Section 27, Township 5 North, Range 28 East of the Willamette Meridian lying 40.00 feet on each side of the following described centerline:

Commencing at the 1/4 corner common to Sections 26 and 27, Township 5 North, Range 28 E.W.M. which is a brass-capped iron pipe buried 6" below the surface of the gravel in the intersection of County Roads 1264 and 1269; thence N89° 47' 58"W, 384.22 feet along the east-west centerline of Section 27 to the true point of beginning of this description: thence \$67° 52′ 14″W, 1076.98 feet: thence S70° 04' **39"W, 658.54 feet: thence** S78° 41′ 38″W, 3.02 feet to a point which bears N11° 18′ 22″W, 40.00 feet from the Northeast Corner of Lot 3 Block 3 of the Charles Tracts Subdivision, said point being the terminus of this description.

3 was calculated by using plat distances and by traversing through monuments found at the Southeast Corner of Lot 1 Block 1 and the Northeast Corner of Lot 5 Block 1 of the Charles Tracts for bearing. The East  $L_4$  corner of Section 27 was also travesed through. Both it and the calculated location of the Northeast Corner of Lot 3 Block 3 were assigned coordinates. The calculated distance and bearing between the two differs substantially from the distance and bearing between the two using the deed description. The physical location of the road and a solidly-built fence on the north also differs from the location described in the deed, especially in the north-south direction. Both the location of the existing road and the fence on the north were used to determine where the road was monumented. The fence appears to have been built around the time the deed was written (1975). It is very solidly built with square concrete corner posts at the angle points. Because there are the same number of corner posts as there are angle points in the deed and they are in the vicinity of where the angle points are called for in the deed in the east-west direction. [ believe the fence to be in the location intended for the northerly right of way line. The road itself shows no evidnce of ever being anywhere except where it is now travelled.

Bearings shown on Block 3 of the Charles Tracts were obtained by rotation to the bearing base I used for this survey, which was the Southeast corner of Section 27 to the East  $V_4$ Corner of Section 27 being NO° 07′ 43″E from County Survey #92-09-B. Pins shown in the Roadway were set 4-6" below the surface of the road. The traverse was run using a Nikon NTD-4 manual total station. Monuments were set in this survey using a Wild T-16 one minute theodolite and a Wild DI-5 EDM.
