IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON FOR UMATILLA COUNTY.

In the Matter of the Vacating of a Portion of County Road #225.

Now on this day this matter coming on regularly to be heard upon the report of A. E. Perry, County Surveyor, who was at the February, 1919 term of this Court, ordered to post notices of the intention of this Court to vacate a portion of County Road #225, beginning near the center of the Southwest Quarter of Section 22, Township 1 South, Range 30 E.W.M., in Umatilla County, Oregon, at the MARK junction of read #225 with another long travelled road coming from the southeast and generally known as the Vinson Canyon road; thence running northeasterly direction through Kramer Canyon, so called, over a portion of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter and the Northeast quarter of said Section, 22, over the Southeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 15, same township and range, and over the West half of Section 14, to a point on the section line running east and west between sections 11 and 14, in said township and range, where said raod #225 first touches said section line upon a public road running east and west, for the vacating of said road, for final hearing,

And it appearing to the Court that due notice of the proceedings in this matter has been given by the posting of three notices in the wicinity of said road, and one notice on the bulletin board at the North door of the County Court house in Pendleton, Oregon, the place of holding of the County Court; that all of said notices have been posted as by law required and the Court being fully satisfied that the public will be benefited by the vacating of said road, and that said road is not greatly needed by the public of Umatilla County,

IT IS THEREFORE, HEREBY ORTERED by the Court that said road as above described be, and the same is hereby vacated, with the understanding, however, that a gate is established and maintained at each end of said road which is proposed to be vacated herein; that such gates, and roadways may be yet be used by the general public.
