

Pendleton, Or., Aug. 14<sup>th</sup> 1886.

To the Hon. County Court, for Umatilla County  
State of Oregon:-

We, the undersigned, viewers  
appointed on a county road leading from Pendleton to  
the mouth of Desolation Creek on the John Day River,  
as prayed for by N. Hendryx and sixty seven others,  
would respectfully report that we met Jno. C Arnold,  
County Surveyor, at the time & place appointed by your Hon.  
body, and proceeded to view out and survey said road as  
prayed for in the petition; we favor the granting of the petition  
and establishment of the road, for the following reasons:

- 1<sup>st</sup>. The route is quite practicable for a wagon road, the grades  
being, in our opinion, comparatively good, and easy.
- 2<sup>nd</sup>. The road is now used as a wagon road to within a dis-  
tance of about three miles of the terminus, and, excepting  
about one  $\frac{1}{4}$  miles, wagons pass over the whole distance.
- 3<sup>d</sup>. The road seems to be very much needed, and is loudly called  
for by citizens in, and near, its vicinity; and, if completed,  
would afford a permanent outlet into the Jno. Day Country  
and kindred portions of Grant County, thereby opening up  
a constant trade with Umatilla County, and which is
