NARRATIVE


The purpose of this survey was to establish the boundary of two parcels of the Blue Mountain Forest Wayside, situated in the southeast augrter of Section 4 and the south one-half of Section 3, T.IN., R. 34 E., W.M. of Umatilla County.

The bearings are from a Solar Observation utilizing the Local Hour Angle method.

Control was established with a Pentax, PX-IOD, total station.

The parks survey crew, R. Hemmer-R. Hill-L. Boge-H. Hanson, found and tied to the control all the Government, Indian Allotment Monuments that were still in what appears to be their original position and necessary to establish the boundaries. Deed distances were used to set park corners on the one-sixteenth lines and section lines. The boundary points between the said park corners have been adjusted accordingly. Deed corners that fall within the area fenced for the right of way of Interstate 84 were not set.
