2001, Richard S. Kaiser, BLM Cadastral Surveyor, corrects the BLM's corner as follows: Point for the N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 22. From this point, the N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 21 and 22, erroneously established by Kaiser, Griffin, and Seibold in 1997—99, bet N. 39°23'09" W., 45.36 ft. dist.; monumented with a stainless steel post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 5 ins. above the ground, in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd. a witnessed as described in the official record. I obliterate all marks on the NE. bearing tree. Remove the stainless steel post and magnet and at the true corner point Reset the stainless steel post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap, from which a bearing tree mkd. by Kaiser, Griffin, and Seibold A ponderosa pine, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 40 1/4° W., 91.8 ft. dist., with a partially healed blaze. and a new bearing tree A ponderosa pine, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 16° E., 55.7 ft. dist., mkd.
