
## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment: Corner established in 1880 by George S. Pershin under General Land Office Contract No. 373.

Surveyor General Records States:

Set basalt stone 14 x 12 x 10 ins. for \$\frac{1}{4}\$ cor.

A 24" Fir bears N 38 E, 19 1ks. A 18" Tamarack bears N 52 W, 36 1ks.



No record of subsequent remonumentation was found in County Records. Description of corner evidence found: Found original stone, call size, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  on W face in a mound of stone, from which:

Original BTs

A rotted fir stump bears N38E 12.5 ft., no scribes visable.
A 24" Tamarack stump bears N52W, 23.8 ft., no scribes visable.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the

original location of this corner

At position of stone, I set  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x30" iron pipe with brass cap marked as shown, 28" in ground, from which:

New BTs

A 15" Fir bears N69E, 41.1 ft, marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ S7 T5S R31E BT. A 10" Fir bears S86W, 12.2 ft. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$ S12 T5S R30E BT.

Nailed brass washer to BT blaze.
Buried stone North and along side pipe.
Set steel fence post 5± ft. North of corner.
Used steel tape and magnetic compasswith 20° E declination.

Measured to face of blaze on original BTs and center of new BTs.
