Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner.

In position of stone, I set 21 x30" pipe with brass cap marked as shown, 24" in ground, from which:

New BTs.

A 14" Pine bears N61°E, 127.6 ft. marked \$59 T5S R30E BT.

A 14" Lodge Role Pine bears S5°W, 32.4 ft. marked \$516 T5S R30E BT.

Nailed brass washer to BT blazes.

Set steel fence post 5±ft. North of corner.

Buried original corner stone South and along side pipe.
