
CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by George S. Pershin under GLO contract number 430, dated 1862. Surveyor General record states: Set a post 4 ft. long 4 ins square 24 ins in ground for cor to secs 11, 12, 13 & 14 merked TSS S12 on NE, R30E S13 on SE, S14 on SW and S11 on NW faces with 4 notches on S and 1 notch on E edges; from which:

A pine 30 ins dia brs S38°E, 10 lks dist marked T5S R30E S13 BT. A pine 20 ins dia brs N69°W, 53 lks dist marked T5S R30E S11 BT. A pine 30 ins dia brs S18°W, 63 lks dist marked T5S R30E S14 BT. No tree within limits in sec 12. Dug pit 18x18x12 ins 5½ ft. dist and raised mound of earth 2 ft. high 4½ ft. base alongside.




Corner remonumented in 1974 by Buane I. Griffith, OPLS 644. His monumentation record states: Found 2 original BTs as follows: A 24" Pine, poor condition, bears \$37°E, 6.6 ft., scribes visible. A 30" Pine, good condition, bears \$16°W, 54.8 ft., scribes visible. No evidence of other BT or original stake found. At corner point, based on original BTs, I set 2½"x30" iron pipe with brass cap marked (shown below), 24" in ground, from which: New BTs A 10" Pine bears N28°E, 12.2 ft. marked T5S R30E S12 BT. A 8" Pine bears \$13°E, 57.7 ft. marked T5S R30E S13 BT. A 18" Pine bears N36°W, 77.1 ft., marked T5S R30E S11 BT. Set steel fence post 5+/- ft. North corner. No record of subsequent monumentation found in Description of corner evidence found:

Found 2½ inch diameter brass cap monument in mound of stone, marked as shown:

Found a 13 inch diameter Penderosa Pine N28°E, 12.2 feet, live and vigorous with scribes visible. Found a 10 inch diameter Penderosa Pine S13°E, 57.7 feet, dead and down with scribes visible. Found a 22 inch diameter Penderosa Pine snag S38°E, 19 lks with scribes visible. Found a 29 inch diameter Penderosa Pine S16°W, 54.8 feet, live and vigorous with scribes visible. Found a 24 inch diameter Penderosa Pine N36°W, 77.1 feet, live and vigorous with scribes visible. Found a 24 inch diameter Penderosa Pine N36°W, 77.1 feet, live and vigorous with scribes visible. Found steel fencepost approximately 5 feet North with rusting attention sign attached.

Distance to the original BTs are to the face of the blaze. Distance to subsequent BTs are to the center of the tree.



Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

From the above described corner monument:

A 12 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S1°E, 28.30 feet marked T5S R30E S13 BT

Painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached bearing tree and land survey monument signs if not previously signed.

Attached land survey monument sign to existing fencepost North of monument.
