A tamarack 24 ins diam. bears S 37° E 20 lks. dist.

Description of corner evidence found:

Nothing found of original evidence. This corner was not re-established on this survey.

Corner area was searched on 2 separate occasions with a 2 person crew. Total search time was 4 1/2 hours. 2 hours of professional land surveyor time was include in the corner search effort. A 200 foot radius around the calculated corner area was searched.

This area has been heavily burnt 60 to 80 years ago. There are charred remains of several large stumps in the corner area, but no evidence of the original corner accessories.

Corner search area was determined by closed traverse control survey.
