## CERTIFIED RECORD OF LAND CORNER MONUMENTATION

History of original corner establishment is hed by Henry Meldrum, U.S. Deputy Surveyor, under Contract No. 380, dated March 19,1881. Surveyor General records state: Set a pine post for 1/4 sec. cor. Pine 6 in. dia. bears N64°W 501ks. Fir 26" in. dia. bears S32°E 321ks. Corner remonumented by a BLM Cadastral Surveyor, John P. Lee, in 1980. His records state:

A19 2-19 DIAGRAM T6S R31E S 35 S 2 T7S 1980

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with a basalt stone, 10x12x23 ins., not of record, firmly set 13 ins. in the ground. no marks visible, from which the remains of the original bearing trees: A fir snag, 28 ins. diam. bears S. 30° E., 32 lks. dist., with partially chopped out blaze, no marks visible. (Record. S. 32° E.), A pine snag, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 64° W., 50 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on partially opened blaze. At the corner point... dist., mkd. 4 S35 BT. Deposit corner stone alongside iron post. See sheet two for additional history records, of corner maintenance performed by Gary Langlitz in July of 1982.

Description of corner evidence found:

34" brass cap on 22" galvanized iron pipe in mound of earth and stone (protruding 8") from which:

A steel fence post is 3.4 feet East of monument with 54-4 and 54-2 signs attached.

A 7" fallen pine snag bears N 65° W - 33.6 feet, to the stumphole.

A 17" douglas fir bears N 5° W - 11.4 feet, with healed blaze.

A 16" douglas fir bears S 58½° E - 41.8 feet, with partially healed blaze.

A 24½" ponderosa pine snag bears S 32° E - 21.1 feet.

Description of monument and accessories lestablished to perpetuate the

original location of this corner:

Attached sign 54-9 to the existing steel fence post, and removed the 54-4 sign.

New bearing trees established:

A 16" douglas fir bears N 82° E - 42.4 feet, scribed: 1/4 S 35 BT. A 14" douglas fir bears S 13° W - 27.4 feet, scribed: 1/4 S 2 BT.

New bearing trees have a brass washer stamped 'PLS 1106'nailed to the face of the blaze. Attached sign 54-3 & 54-9, painted face of blaze & 6" band around each bearing tree, red.

I hereby certify that the above corner monument was properly maintained to U.S.F.S. standards by me on August 10,1993.
