Found a 2 1/2" iron pipe, firmly set, with brass cap marked as described in the Gaylord Record (refer to Umatilla Co. Surveyor's Record No. 82-102-R), from which:

The stumps of the original Campbell BT's exist as described in the Gaylord record, And BT's marked by Gaylord,

A 10" Douglas Fir bears S 13°E 73.9 ft. This tree is alive and in good condition, it does not appear to have been marked as described in the Gaylord record. And a 16" Douglas Fir, alive with partially healed blaze bears S 40°W 90.4 links.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:
