
History of original corner establishment:

Corner originally established by Frank W. Campbell under GLO contract number 468, dated April 12, 1883. Surveyor General record states:



Set a pine post 3 ft long 3 ins square 24 inches in the ground for ¼ sec cor marked ¼S on W face from which:

A fir 24 ins dia brs S58°E 19 lks dist marked ¼S BT
A fir 12 ins dia brs N40°W 12 lks dist marked ¼S BT
Corner remonumented in 1967 by James E. Jelley, et al, BLM
Group no. 350. His notes state; The ¼ cor of secs 25 and
30, monumented with a mound of stone 2 ft base 1 ft high from which the remains of the original bearing trees: A decayed fir stump, size indeterminate, bears S58°E 19 lks dist with scribes visible. A fir 20 ins diam bears N40°W 12 lks dist with healed blaze. At the corner point set an iron post in a mound of stone 2 ft base to top with brass cap marked; (markings shown below) from which new bearing trees: A pine 19 ins diam bears S3°E 22½ lks dist marked ¾ S30 BT (1967). A fir 9 ins diam bears N83½°W 23½ lks dist marked ¾ S25 BT (1967). A fir 7 ins diam bears N77°E 21½ lks dist marked ¾ S25 BT (1978).


No record of subsequent monumentation found in Umatilla County survey records.

Description of corner evidence found:

Found a standard BLM brass cap marked as shown, in a mound of stone.

Original BTs: Found an approximate 40 inch diam fir stump S58°E 12.5 feet, rotted with scribes visible.
Found a 21 inch diameter Fir N40°W, 7.9 feet, sick and dying with blaze evident.

BLM BTs: Found a 9 inch diameter Fir N77°E, 14.2 feet, sick and dying with blaze evident. Found a 11 inch diameter Fir N83½°W, 15.5 feet, sick and dying with blaze evident. Found a 21 inch diameter Pine S3°E, 14.8 feet, live and vigorous with scribes visible.



Found a steel fencepost approximately 3 feet North with 54-4 and 54-2 signs attached.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner: From the existing found BLM brass cap monument:

New BT:

A 27 inch diameter Ponderosa Pine bears S40°W, 72.67 feet marked % S25 BT Painted a 6 inch red band around all BTs and attached 54-3 and 54-9 signs.

I hereby certify that the above corner point was perpetuated as hereon described on July 17, 1987.

I attached a brass washer marked ODIS 644 to the PT block of the process. OPLS 644 to the BT blaze.
