Description of corner evidence found:

Found standard BLM brass cap stamped as indicated in the record, firmly set in the ground.

from which

A 13" Ponderosa Pine bears N17 1/2 W, 22.5' with partially visible scribing.

A 9" Ponderosa Pine nears S2 E, 7..9' with the top recently broken out and dead.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner:

Scribed CW1/16 S36 BT on a 9" Ponderosa Pine which bears S20 1/2 E, 11.4'. Nailed an aluminum washer stamped RLS 852 between the letters B and T. Made a band around each tree and painted the bands and the scribe blazes red. Attached Forest Service Land Survey Monument and Bearing Tree signs to each tree. Set steel guard post 5' west of the monument and attached Forest Service Land Survey Monument tree signs.
