This point is located in the SE 1/4 of section 36, T. 6 S., R 33 E.

At a high point on the ridge between Winom Creek and Upper Long Meadows, Elevation 5652 feet, as described in the wilderness boundary description. This point is the top of a basalt boulder which is 12 feet by 7 feet by 2 feet high. The boulder is flat on top and at a point 1.5 feet from the southeasterly edge and 5.1 feet from the northeasterly edge, I mark an "X" at the corner point. From which:

An 8 inch Douglas-fir bears N71 $^{\rm o}$ W, 11.3 feet. An 8 inch Juniper bears N 42 $^{\rm o}$ E, 37.7 feet.

Both trees are scribed "WB/455 BT" on a single blaze and have a 3/4 inch brass washer, marked "PLS 1636", nailed flush to the lower portion of the blaze. Both trees are additionally signed with "Bearing Tree", "Land Survey Monument" and 27-6a, "National Forest Wilderness", signs.
