Did not find the original post, but a 2" galvanized pipe had been driven near the corner location. Three of the BT's are alive and in good condition. The NW BT has been cut and is a deteriorating stump.

original location of this corner Established the corner location using the BT info of above and set a 2"x30" galvanized pipe with a flared end and 22" bress cap 24" in the ground. Surrounded monument with a rock mound 6" high and 30" in diameter. Set a 4"x4"x6' redwood post 20" in theground 4' West of the monument with signs 54-2 & 54-4 as a guard post for the corner. Scalped bark and painted red band around Bearing Trees and posted signs 54-3 with the following information:
